

Deacon

The Office of Deacon¹

The account of the Seven in Acts 6 is sometimes understood as the origin of the office of deacon (διάκονος, *diakonos*) mentioned in Paul's writings (compare Rom 16:1; 1 Tim 3:8; Hiebert, "Behind the Word 'Deacon,'" 155). Bock suggests that, although the qualifications for the deacon go beyond the requirements for the Seven listed in Acts 6, we may see a proto-deacon role here (see Bock, *Acts*, 262).

Deacon Qualifications²

Desired qualifications for those serving the office of deacon will be the qualifications set forth in the New Testament (such as those found in 1 Timothy 3: 8-13 as well as other scriptures). However, the specific understanding and application of New Testament references are the responsibility of the individual member. Each church member is charge with the responsibility to seek God's leadership in interpreting scriptural references regarding deacon qualifications when selecting a person for the office of deacon. The selection of an individual asserts their qualification and affirms their qualification.

Such desired qualifications are as follows:

1. He is full of the Holy Spirit (Acts 6:3,5) — Such men are spiritually minded and submissive to God's leadership.
2. He is full of wisdom (Acts 6:3) — Such men have spiritual knowledge and understanding that provide sound direction for the ministry of the church.
3. He is full of faith (Acts 6:5) — Spiritual men walk by faith and not by sight because they know and trust the God of the Word and believe in the Word of God.
4. He has a good reputation (Acts 6:3) — Such a man demonstrates integrity and honesty to others. He has a believable Christian life.
5. The man should be grave or dignified and worthy of respect (1 Timothy 3:8) — Such a man faces life seriously and there is a certain stateliness about him that commands respect.
6. He is a man who is not double-tongued, but is sincere in his speech (1 Timothy 3:8) — Such a man should speak with verbal honesty and integrity, not saying one thing to one person and something else to another.
7. He should exercise self control and abstain from questionable things for the sake of personal testimony and others (1 Timothy 3:8) — He realizes the importance of his Christian influence and is willing to limit his liberty for the sake of others.
8. He is not a greedy person (1 Timothy 3:8) — Such a man is free from the love of money and other earthly possessions.

9. The man has a deep biblical commitment (1 Timothy 3: 9) — The man holds to the truths of the Christian faith with a clear conscience. He is not easily swayed from the truth because he strives to live what he knows.
10. He must first be tested and proven (1 Timothy 3:10) — The man must have proven over time that he is faithful and that his walk is credible.
11. He must also be beyond reproach and blameless (1 Timothy 3:10) — Such a man must display a lifestyle free from continual patterns of scriptural disobedience. There should be nothing in his life for which he could be accused and thus disqualified.
12. The man's wife should be a woman worthy of respect, not a malicious gossip, but temperate and faithful in everything (1 Timothy 3:11) — The spouse should be devoted to God and yielded to the Holy Spirit.
13. He should be the husband of only one wife (1 Timothy 3:12) — He should be devoted and faithful to his wife.
14. He should manage his children and his household well (1 Timothy 3:12) — Such a man should demonstrate leadership in his home life. He should have a well-ordered family life and well-behaved children (still under his authority).
15. He must recognize God-given spiritual leadership that is incumbent upon the office of the pastor and seek to submit to his leadership (Hebrews 13:7, 17).
16. He should practice "storehouse tithing" of his family income (Malachi 3:10).
17. He should do all he can to create and preserve unity and harmony in the church (Ephesians 4:1-3).

Please Note: Nominees must be at least twenty-five (25) years of age and a member of Springfield Baptist Church for at least two (2) years.

<p>What SBC Deacons do ...</p>

... The deacons of SBC seek to be a brotherhood of committed Christian men praying for and loving each other and seeking to provide Godly service and leadership to Springfield Baptist Church.

... Pray at offering time during Worship services as assigned, and errand for ushers to gather the offering during this time.

... Participate in the widows and widowers program.

... Help serve the Lord's Supper.

... Participate in all church programs (ie. Reach Robertson, Senior Adult Banquet, Trunk or Treat, etc.).

... Attend all regular and special called deacon's meetings unless providentially hindered. The deacon vice chairman will contact all deacons who miss meetings as soon as possible.

... Pray daily for church staff, members and fellow deacons.

... Multiply the pastor's office by shepherding members in times of need.

Deacon Covenant

1. We covenant, with God's help, to measure up to the best of our ability to the qualifications as set forth in 1 Timothy 3: 8-12.
2. We covenant with each other to the best of our ability to live holy Christian lives, not allowing our conduct to bring reproach on our church or the cause of Christ (Ephesians 4:1).
3. We covenant to support all of the programs of the church and be faithful in our attendance (Hebrews 10: 25).
4. We covenant to participate in storehouse tithing, giving regularly to support the church's efforts in the cause of Christ (Malachi 3:10; 2 Corinthians 9:8-11).
5. We covenant with each other to be fully cooperative with our pastor and staff in the mission and ministry of the church. To share in the responsibility of pastoral care of our church family (Ephesians 4:11-12; Philippians 2:3-4).
6. We covenant with each other to always refrain from destructive criticism toward our pastor, our church and its members, always willing to help in settling disputes in a quite Christian manner. To not be divisive in our church at any time (Ephesians 4:3-4; Philippians 2-5; James 4:11).
7. We covenant with each other to attend all deacons meetings unless providentially hindered (Hebrews 10: 25).
8. We covenant with each other to keep in confidence those things which, in the best interest of the church, should not be discussed outside the deacons meeting and body (Ephesians 4:29).

We covenant with each other to live out this covenant, to hold each other accountable in Christian love, and when necessary to seek to restore a brother deacon in the spirit of Galatians 6:1 (Psalm 103: 17-18).

Church Council

Springfield Baptist Church

I. Purpose: The church council is to assist Springfield Baptist Church in carrying out the Great Commission in the spirit of the Great Commandment. It is the organization through which the ministries and committees coordinate their activities. The council shall be responsible for managing and overseeing all facets of church function including, but not limited to calendar planning and priorities, coordinating and evaluating ministries priorities, fostering communication within the various ministries and committees. Note: The council does not replace the work of standing committees or ministries but works to enhance communication, coordination and collaboration.

II. Membership and Term of Office: Because of the nature and responsibilities of the church council, its membership and term of office shall fall outside the regular church committee policy. The council shall consist of the senior pastor and eight (8) non-staff members who are in good standing with the church, of whom shall be a minimum of 2 men and 2 women. The only default member shall be the chairman of the deacons, who shall serve a 1-year term on the council commensurate with his term as chairman of the deacons, all other members of the council shall serve a 3-year term, utilizing the same church year designated for other elected positions. A chairperson of the council shall be elected annually by members of the council. Should a member of the council vacate his or her term prior to the completion of the term, the council shall enlist a replacement to finish out the term.

- The initial church council shall be selected and nominated by the transition team and be voted on and approved by majority of the members of the church. Each member of the initial council, other than the chairman of the deacons, shall serve a full 3-year term with no rotation off during the initial term.
- After the initial term of the church council and thereafter, a portion of members of the council shall rotate off every year after serving their 3-year term. Any members rotating off the church council must take a minimum of 1 election cycle off from being re-elected from the annual church council election process; however, they may serve if the church council requests for them to replace a vacated position during an active term. Beginning with the 4th year, 3 council members shall rotate off the council and be replaced with 3 new members; beginning with the 5th year, 2 council shall rotate off the council and be replaced with 2 new members; beginning with the 6th year, 2 council members shall rotate off the council and be replaced with 2 new members. Prospective nominees for church council shall be nominated by the church body, voted upon by the church body, and receive at least a majority vote by the church body. Thereafter, prior to the appointment of the nominees to the church council, the nominees shall be vetted by an ad hoc

team consisting of the senior pastor, chairperson of the church council, and church moderator, who shall have the final authority to accept or decline the nominee for church council.

The senior pastor shall be a member of the council, but shall not have voting privileges. The senior pastor and/or appropriate staff designee shall represent the interest of the church staff before the council. The senior pastor sets the agenda for and conducts the council meetings. In the absence of the senior pastor the chairperson of the council will set the agenda and conduct the council meetings.

Each member of the council shall be assigned responsibility for various standing church committees. The council member shall not be the chairperson of assigned committees. Each council member shall represent the interests of the assigned committees before the council and shall be responsible for communicating and advocating the activities, interests and concerns of the assigned committees at each council meeting.

The council shall meet no less than monthly at a set date and time agreed upon and set by the council. Special called meetings may be conducted for matters that require immediate attention or cannot wait until the next regular scheduled meeting. A quorum for all council meetings shall be 75% of council members and a minimum of 6 votes is required to affirmatively pass a motion.

III. Church Council Qualifications:

- A council member shall not have a spouse, parent, or child in another leadership position of the church (staff, committee chair, and/or council).
- A council member shall exhibit the spiritual gifts of service, leadership, and discernment in other areas of ministry and service within the church such as committees, ministerial, VBS, Mission Springfield, etc.
- A council member shall be an active member of SBC for a minimum of three (3) years.
- A council member shall exemplify those characteristics identified in the Church Council Covenant and be willing to commit himself/herself to God and the members of SBC by formally adopting the Covenant upon appointment to the council.

IV. Principal Duties:

- Coordinate and synchronize the decision-making processes of the church to enhance better communication and coordination of ministries and resources.
- Collaborate with ministry and committee leaders to develop and implement a comprehensive program of worship, evangelism, missions, discipleship, enlistment, equipping, and stewardship necessary to carry out the Great Commission in the spirit of the Great Commandment.
- Make recommendations to the church related to ministries and church priorities, (all recommendations from committees or ministries must be

vetted and approved by the council before being presented to the church body for a vote).

- Preparing for approval by the church a calendar of activities for accomplishing the above objectives.
- The council shall report to the church at least once each quarter.
- Recommending and/or approving activities and procedures for the church programs and service organizations. All recommendations from committees or ministries must be vetted and approved by the council before being presented to the church body for a vote).
- Regularly evaluating the results of all programs, ministries, and activities and recommending changes where needed.
- Enhancing communication between church ministries and committees to avoid conflict, confusion and duplication.
- Administering church discipline as specified in the church by-laws.

Church Council Covenant

Having agreed to serve as a member of the Church Council and being in agreement with the vision, mission, ministries and purpose of Springfield Baptist Church (SBC), I now commit myself to God and to the members of SBC to do the following:

- I commit to be faithful to:
 - God
 - My Family
 - The Church
- I commit to be a person of integrity by:
 - Maintaining honesty, respectability and confidentiality
 - Being humble, blameless and upright
 - Being an encourager
 - Being willing to collaborate with others
- I commit to be a person of prayer by:
 - Having a consistent daily prayer life
 - Seeking God's will to be revealed in all matters
 - Supporting the Council through my daily and consistent prayers
- I commit to seek God's wisdom by:
 - Daily Bible Study and reflection
 - Regular and active participation in the Bible Studies and Worship services at SBC
 - Seeking the guidance and power of the Holy Spirit in all things
- I commit to be a peacemaker by:
 - Being a good listener
 - Being a supportive advocate for the church Staff and the Council
 - Refusing to spread gossip
 - Being a cooperative member of the Council
 - Always seeking to diffuse conflict Biblically
- I commit to be a willing servant by:
 - Giving of my time, talent and resources
 - Giving at least a tithe of my income to SBC while supporting other missions and other causes of the church
 - Being willing to be equipped for ministry and to equip others
 - Walking the walk of the Christian faith
 - Discovering and using my spiritual gifts in the life of the church and beyond
- I commit to demonstrate accountability through continual spiritual growth by:
 - Being responsible to God, my family and SBC through my actions, words and deeds
 - Being accountable to the Council and to represent the best interest of the church
 - Leading out in service and ministry to the membership

Roles and Relationships of Committees

Article V: Paragraph 2 – Purpose

1. Standing and select committees will be accountable for the exercise of authority as specifically delegated by the church.
2. The Assembly, by definition, will consist of all those eligible voting members of this church (quorum a minimum) who assemble together as a “committee of the whole.”
3. The Assembly will specifically deal with the selection of the deacon body, the pastor selection committee, pastoral team selection committees, and the election of messenger to denominational meetings.

Paragraph 3: - Relationships

All committees of this church, whether select or standing, will be solely responsible to the church. They will be accountable for functional performance as herein specified and in the framework of the expressed desire of the church. No committee will have authority over any other committee. Appropriate cooperation between committees is expected and will be manifested.

Decision Making

- * Senior Pastor is a non-voting member of the Church Council (no rotation).
- * Deacon Chairman is a voting member of the Church Council (1-year rotation).
- * Church Council will annually elect its chairperson and vice chair.
- * Quorum is 75% of voting church council members (6 of 8).
- * Six (6) affirmative votes minimum required to pass a motion.
- * Senior Pastor sets the agenda and conducts the Council meetings.
- * Senior Pastor and/or his staff designee represents the interest of the Church Staff.
- * The church council is an extension and multiplication of the pastoral office.
- * The church council member is to help oversee particular ministries of the church with a duty to collaborate, communicate and synergies all efforts of the church with the pastor, ministerial staff and other church council members.



